SAFETY MESSAGE

As we continue to witness a distressing rise in antisemitic incidents, it has become crucial for members of the Jewish community to increase their knowledge and awareness of synagogue safety. Jewish safety training is an essential step toward safeguarding ourselves and our places of worship against threats and acts of hate. By equipping ourselves with the necessary skills and knowledge, we can actively contribute to countering antisemitism and ensuring the protection of our community's physical and spiritual well-being.

Antisemitism is an age-old prejudice and hatred against Jewish individuals; however, its resurgence in recent years has caused grave concern worldwide. From hateful rhetoric and discriminatory acts to violent attacks, antisemitism poses a real and pressing threat to Jewish individuals and their sense of security. Synagogues, being significant symbols of Jewish faith and heritage, have become targets for these acts of hatred, emphasizing the urgent need for community members to engage in Jewish safety training.

Our training opportunities in conjunction with other synagogues in greater WNC through national providers, provide members with the expertise and skills necessary to prevent, identify, and respond effectively to potential threats. Learning about risk assessment, emergency protocols, and proper communication channels significantly enhance one's ability to handle critical situations. By attending safety trainings, individuals become proactive participants in ensuring the security of their synagogue and community.

Training fosters a strong sense of collective responsibility and unity within the Jewish community. By coming together to enhance our knowledge of synagogue safety, we create a network of informed individuals who can support and protect one another. This sense of unity bolsters our ability to respond cohesively in emergency situations, which we pray will never occur, by mitigating potential risks.

Investing your time and effort in our safety efforts not only equips you with practical skills but also fosters a deeper understanding of the historical context and implications of antisemitism. By engaging in these programs, members gain valuable insights into the ideology behind hatred and prejudice, allowing for more informed discussions and the prevention of the spread of misinformation. Education and awareness are essential tools in combatting antisemitism, ultimately leading to a more inclusive and tolerant society.

Given the concerning rise in antisemitic incidents in recent years, and especially as the High Holidays are upon us, Jewish safety training has become an essential component in protecting our community and securing our synagogues.

Moreover, these programs promote education, raise awareness, and foster community resilience. Let us not wait for tragedy to strike before taking action. Instead, let us empower ourselves, educate our members, and work collectively to combat antisemitism and promote synagogue

We continually offer these FREE trainings online, in addition to in-person CPR and Stop Bleeding courses, yet sadly, very few take advantage of our efforts. Sessions last about an hour, and we strongly urge you to participate when you receive notice to register or attend an event. They are interesting, thought provoking and educational.

Mountain Synagogue belongs to a security network that includes the Security Teams of all Jewish organizations in our area, including Asheville, Boone, and Hickory, and we meet monthly to discuss national and local issues.

REMEMBER: Should you see <u>anything</u> out of the ordinary before, during or after services, please bring it to our security guards' attention as well as mine. If possible, notate the date, time, and location, then take some photos! We share our information with other synagogues in our network.

Be safe, be vigilant, be observant, look around where you are, but not down at your cellphone!
